


About NSS



The National Service Scheme is an Indian government sponsored public service programme conducted by the Ministry of youth affairs and Sports of the government of India. Popularly known as NSS, the scheme was launched in Gandhiji's centenary year in 1969. Aimed at developing student's personality through community service, NSS is a voluntary association of young people in colleges.

The programme aims to instill the idea of social welfare in students, and to provide service to society without bias. NSS volunteers work to ensure that everyone who is needy gets help to enhance their standard of living and lead a life of dignity. Soft Skill Development:

Rules and Regulations:- Admission Rules



- 1) Reservation of Seats as per Punjab Government policy in all the courses.
- 2) Admission is open to both Boys and Girls on the basis of merit.
- 3) For admission to any class, candidate will apply on a prescribed form
- 4) Admission form should be legibly filled by applicant in his/her handwriting. Please fill your name as given the matriculation certificate.
- 5) As per clause 6 of the Punjabi university ordinances, to qualify for admission to 3 rd semester of the course, the candidate must have passed 50% of total papers of the two semesters of the 1st year. In case, the result of 2 nd semester is not declared at the time of admission 3rd semester, (the student may be admitted provisionally and will be allowed to take examination of 3rd Semester). Similarly, to qualify for admission to 5th semester of the course, the student may be admitted provisionally if the result of the previous semester has not been declared and will be allowed to take examination of 5th Semester, if he/she has passed 50% of the total papers of previous semester.
- 6) Admission of students, whose result has been declared as "later on", may be done with 15 days of declaration of result.
- 7) Attach attested copies of the following in the admission form:
 - (i) Matriculation, 10+2, B.A/B.A.B.Ed./B.Sc Part-I & II DMc's
 - (ii) Copy of Adhar Card & Voter Card
 - (iii) Character Certificate from institution attended earlier.
 - (iv) Certificate(s) of Extra Curricular Activities.
 - $(v) SC \, Certificate \, supported \, with \, income \, Certificate \, is sued \, by \,$

Tehsildar/Welfare Officer any equivalent Revenue Officer.

- (vi) Eligibility Certificate from Punjabi University, Patiala (ifapplicable).
- (vii) Migration Certificate/Discharge Certificate for student coming from other University/College.
- 8) Selected Candidate will deposit the fee immediately otherwise the offer for admission will stand cancelled.
- 9) As per Punjabi University Norms:-(i) The following categories of candidates shall be allowed to opt for the paper of Punjabi (Elementary Knowledge) in lieu of Punjabi Compulsory in B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.; other related courses:
 - (a) Candidates who have passed their Matriculation /10+2 examination from the schools/Institutions situated outside the state of Punjab and have not studied Punjabi.
- (b) Wards of Defence/Paramilitary personnel, the concerned students must submit their relevant documents in the college office within the dates specified below:-

A Without late fee 31 st August

B With late fee of Rs.3000/-30th September

CWith late fee of Rs. 5000/- 31st October

- (ii) The Students who have passed 10+2 examination from boards other than P.S.E.B. Mohali, Board of Education Haryana, Himachal Pradesh Board of School Education, C.B.S.E and I.C.S.E. will get an eligibility certificate from Registration Branch, Punjabi University, Patiala.
- (iii) If a student joins a course of Punjabi University, after qualifying a part of it from some other Boards/Universities, he will qualify the deficient papers by filling examination forms and examination fee as per University rules.
- (iv) During the session, admission to different courses of semester system will be available on the basis of Re-evaluation within 15 days but not later than the date notified by the University.
- All the students of under graduate classes have to qualify the following papers as per the norms of Punjabi University, Patiala.
- 1. Drug Abuse: Problem, Management and Prevention (Sem. II)
- 2. Environmental Studies and Road Safety Awareness (Sem. III)

OTHER RULES

Migration Rules:

Migration is possible in 3rd semester only in case of parents shift/transfer to another city. Otherwise migration is possible after submitting the full course fee.

HOUSE EXAMINATION

- (i) House Examination for semester system classes will be held twice in each semester.
- (ii) A student must get prior permission from the Principal for his/her inability to be present in the House Examination.
- (iii) The Students, who do not qualify the house examination as per University Rules or remain absent during the house exam., they may be allowed to appear in the Special House Examination with the Principal's permission. Such students will have to pay re-examination fee.

As per Punjabi University Norms: To Appear in University examination following are the House Test and **Attendance related conditions:**

- (I) Eligibility to appear in university examination in all the degree courses in 35% marks in aggregate or 35% marks in all the individual subjects.
- (ii) Attendance required to appear in university examination is 75% of the total lectures delivered. Rules for condoning the shortage of lectures are as follows:
- (a) Principal can condone 6% of the lectures.
- (b) Another 6% can be condoned by a committee constituted for this purpose.

LEAVE RULES

- 1) Name of the student will be stuck off from the college register if a student continuously remains absent for 10 days without any leave application approval.
- $2) Sick \, Leave \, should \, be \, accompanied \, by \, a \, medical \, certificate \, is sued \, by \, a \, doctor.$
- 3) Leave application should be countersigned by parents/guardian of the students.
- 4) Every leave should be approved by the concerned Head of the Department.
- 5) For counting of lectures, no leave other than duty leave will be contented.

LIBRARY RULES

- 1) Library will remain open from 09:00am to 04:00pm on all working days.
- 2) A student can get maximum of 02 books for 14 days.
- 3) Student can get a book re-issued, if there is no demand from other student.
- 4) There will be a fine of Rs. 2/- per day for the books retained beyond the date of return.
- 5) In case of spoiling the books or in case of getting it lost somewhere, student will bear the expenses of replacing the book. If it cannot be replaced due to non-availability, the fine will be determined by the Principal.
- 6) Students will not be issued reference books/rare books/journals/magazines.
- 7) Issued books can be requisitioned any time by the Librarian.
- 8) Use of Mobile Phone in Library is strictly prohibited.
- 9) Security fee payable at the time of admission Rs. 1000/-(one time, refundable)

PARKING RULES

- 1) The students must park their vehicle in the parking area at their own risk. Nobody is allowed to park the vehicle on the road. Cars or Jeeps are not allowed.
- 2) Do not sit on the parked Vehicles.
- 3) The Students are advised to get their cycles/Scooters/Motercycles insured against theft and not to Keep wallets, bags, money or cell phones in parked vehicle.

FINE FOR ABSENTEE

Fines for absentees will be notified later on College Notice Board.

COLLEGE LEAVING POLICY

- 1) A student desirous of leaving the college will apply in writing and the application must be countersigned by parents/guardian.
- 2) Students will have to return library books and identity Card.
- 3) Student will clear all dues and fines.
- 4) Student will have to furnish a "No Dues Certificate" in the office.
- 5) Certificates/Testimonials will not be issued to the student who leave college without approval of Principal or without submitting the, "No Dues Certificate".
- 6) College leaving rules will be, as notified by University time to time.

FEE PAYMENT RULES

- 1) Fee for odd semesters will be paid in June/July and fee for even semesters in November as per schedules to be notified by the College.
- 2) Student will ensure deposit of fee by due date even if he/she is on leave.
- 3) A fine will be imposed on payment of fee after the due date.
- 4) Name of the student will be stuck off from college rolls in case of undue delay in deposit of fee. Such a student can get re-admission by depositing all dues and fines within 15 days.

FEE REFUND POLICY

Last date for submission of application for claiming refund of fee is fixed by Punjabi University Patiala, Refund applications will be processed as per rules of Punjabi University, Patiala.

REFUND OF SECURITY

- 1) The student will submit a Refund Form along with original receipt countersigned by parents/guardians, in case of leaving the college/migration completion of course.
- 2) If a student does not apply for refund of security, no refund will be made after one year.
- 3) Form for refund of security should be submitted within the month of July/August.

MISCELLANEOUS RULES

- 1) Ragging is an illegal offence. Ragging is strictly prohibited in the college campus. Strict disciplinary or legal action will be taken against the student involved in an act of ragging.
- 2) Use of Mobile Phones is strictly Prohibited in the college campus
- 3) Every student must carry Identity Card.
- 4) Section once allotted to the student will not be changed.
- 5) It is the responsibility of students to read the notices displayed on notice board every day.
- 6) Rules mentioned in the prospectus can be changed from time to time.
- 7) College should be immediately communicated in case of change of Phone number of parents/guardians.
